



BRUNEI DARUSSALAM – SINGAPORE RECIPROCAL GREEN LANE

(Updated 28 July 2021)

1. This document serves as guidelines for inbound travelers of foreign nationalities arriving in Brunei Darussalam from Singapore on the Reciprocal Green Lane Agreement for official or essential business travel.
2. The sponsoring agency is required to apply for an Entry Travel Pass on behalf of the travelers and provide the following documents with the online application:
 - Traveler's passport
 - Tentative flight itinerary
 - Tentative hotel reservation in Brunei Darussalam for mandatory self-isolation purposes. Approved hotels for mandatory self isolation can be found on the drop-down list on the Entry Travel Pass application page online. It is the responsibility of the Sponsoring agency to book directly with hoteliers and secure such accommodation before arrival. Change of hotels during the determined isolation period is not permitted.
 - A signed letter of undertaking from the sponsoring agency, stating that self-isolation accommodation costs and COVID-19 RT-PCR tests upon arrival will be borne by the sponsoring agency and assuring that the traveler has been in good health and remained in the country of departure for 14 days prior to the intended date of travel
 - If sponsoring agency is a registered private company, a letter of endorsement from the relevant Brunei Darussalam authority or government agency
 - If the traveler is intending to make official travel to Brunei Darussalam, the sponsoring agency being a national authority or government agency must submit a supporting letter from the Permanent Secretary or Head of said agency
 - A bubble-wrapped itinerary for the entire duration of the traveler's stay in Brunei Darussalam
3. Entry Travel Pass applications must be submitted **at least 8 working days before intended date of travel.**
4. Applicants and sponsors are advised to refer to press releases published on the Prime Minister's Office pertaining to updates on travel restriction policies that may change from time to time.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The contact person of the sponsoring agency must be available to be contacted at all times during the duration of the traveler's stay in Brunei Darussalam.
2. Upon arrival, travelers will be required to undergo self-isolation at hotel accommodation for a period of 2 days which will be determined via the self-isolation notice that is given upon arrival by the Ministry of Health.
3. The traveler must have remained in Singapore for the last 14 days prior to departure for Brunei.
4. Travelers are required to undertake pre-departure COVID-19 Polymerase Chain Reaction (SARS-COV-2 RT-PCR) testing within 72 hours prior to departure at a designated medical center that is recognized by the government of Singapore. Travelers should refrain from leaving their place of residence for non-essential reasons during the period of time between undergoing the PCR test and departing the country for Brunei Darussalam. A negative SARS-COV-2 RT-PCR test result must be presented to the airline upon departure before travelling to Brunei. The test result certificate must clearly state 'RT-PCR' in order to be authenticated.
5. The sponsoring agency is required to make a payment for the post-arrival SARS-COV-2 RT-PCR Test for the traveler before the date of arrival in Brunei Darussalam. Payment can be made online via this link: <https://www.healthinfo.gov.bn/entry-payment/#/user/login> . Alternatively payment can also be made at the following service counters:

Please obtain a 'Government of Brunei Darussalam' or 'Ministry of Health' payment receipt and provide a scanned copy for the traveler to present to authorities when required. Do ensure that the receipt states the name and passport number of the traveler. An appointment for the post-arrival SARS-COV-2 RT-PCR will be determined upon arrival. For inquiries and further information regarding the requirement to make pre-payment for a post-arrival SARS-COV-2 RT-PCR Test, sponsors may contact Ministry of Health via e-mail at etp.health@moh.gov.bn

6. Travelers are required to download the BruHealth App prior to departure. Sponsoring agency must also prepare Brunei SIM cards for travelers ahead of their arrival to ensure smooth BruHealth registration upon arrival.
7. Upon check-in at the airport, the Entry Travel Pass holder will be required to present to the airline / border authorities:
 - Valid Entry Travel Pass
 - A negative result slip of a SARS-COV-2 RT-PCR test taken within 72 hours of the date of departure or an exemption letter from Ministry of Health

- Valid air ticket
- Valid proof of payment for post-arrival SARS-COV-2 RT-PCR test
- Hotel reservation in Brunei Darussalam
- Proof of installation of BruHealth App on mobile phone
- Valid visa (for visa-required passport holders).

Failure to do so may result in refusal of boarding / entry.

8. Transportation from the airport to the selected isolation accommodation must be arranged and provided by the declared hotel accommodation. Travelers will be transported directly to the designated hotel.
9. The Sponsoring Agency must ensure that upon arrival, travelers proceed immediately to the declared accommodation and not leave the hotel during the entire period of self-isolation except to undergo SARS-COV-2 RT PCR test at the designated center.

Under the Infectious Diseases Act (Amendments) Order 2020, any traveler arriving in Brunei Darussalam is required to undergo mandatory self-isolation. Failure to comply to this requirement is an offence under the Infectious Diseases Act (Chapter 204) and if found guilty, will be liable to a fine for up to \$10,000 or imprisonment for a period of up to 6 months or both.

10. The traveler may not take public transport, taxis or ride-hailing services during their stay. The sponsoring agency must arrange for private transportation for the traveler.
11. Upon arrival, the traveler must have already installed the BruHealth mobile application, register and self-report their health condition on a daily basis for the duration of their stay. The traveler must also scan in their locations at all times using the QR codes displayed at all premises.
12. The sponsor must supervise a bubble-wrapped itinerary for the traveler's stay in Brunei Darussalam and ensure that the traveler only commutes point-to-point between the airport, hotel, swab center and workplaces as determined in the itinerary.
