



GUIDELINES FOR ENTRY TRAVEL PASS APPLICATIONS TO ENTER BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

The Entry Travel Pass is a document issued for inbound travellers of foreign nationalities arriving in Brunei Darussalam.

The Entry Travel Pass may be issued for the following individuals:



Essential business travel
(including official travel)



Students

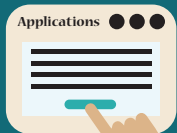


Medical treatment



Compassionate and other
special circumstances

APPLICATION AND PRE-DEPARTURE PROCEDURES



Applications must be submitted by the sponsoring (receiving) agency or sponsoring family member in Brunei Darussalam on behalf of the traveller via **Entry Travel Pass portal**

The contact person of the sponsoring agency or sponsoring family member must be available to be contacted at all times.



If the traveller is intending to make official travel to Brunei Darussalam, the sponsoring agency being a national authority or government agency must submit a supporting letter from the Permanent Secretary or Head of said agency.

If the traveller is intending to make business travel to Brunei Darussalam, the sponsoring agency being a private company must obtain and submit a letter of endorsement from the relevant Brunei Darussalam authority or government agency



Applications must be submitted **at least 8 working days before intended date of travel.**

(This list serves only as examples and do not necessarily indicate such fields are deemed as essential business nor guaranteed endorsement. Endorsement requests to government agencies are subject to their respective review and considerations.)

Legal	Prime Minister's Office
Financial Institutions	Ministry of Finance and Economy
Defence	Ministry of Defence
Oil and Gas	Ministry of Energy
Healthcare	Ministry of Health
Education	Ministry of Education
Agriculture Fisheries	Ministry of Primary Resources and Tourism

Upon arrival, travellers will be required to undergo self-isolation at hotel accommodation.



Eligibility of Entry Travel Pass



Travellers must have remained within the country of departure for the last 14 days prior to departure for Brunei

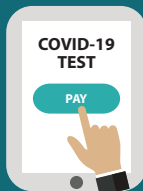


Transit while en-route to Brunei is only permitted in a country with an equivalent or lower risk category as per Ministry of Health risk assessment. The traveller may not leave the airport while in transit

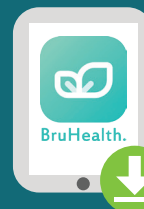
PRE-DEPARTURE COVID-19 TESTS & REQUIREMENTS



Undertake pre-departure COVID-19 PCR test 72 hours from departure at a designated medical center that is recognised by the government of the country of departure



Payment to be made before the date of arrival in Brunei Darussalam



Travellers are required to download the BruHealth App prior to departure

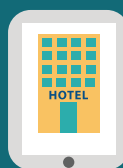
A negative COVID-19 PCR test result slip within 72 hours



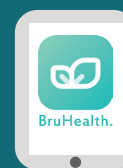
Valid air ticket



Valid proof of payment for post-arrival COVID-19 PCR test



Hotel reservation in Brunei Darussalam



Proof of installation of BruHealth App on phone



Valid visa (for visa-required passport holders).

ARRIVAL PROCEDURES AND LOGISTICS



Travellers should request for post arrival swab and logging and self-assessment on BruHealth app



Travellers should proceed immediately to the declared accommodation



Travellers must not leave the hotel during the entire period of self-isolation except to undergo COVID-19 PCR test at the designated center

Under the Infectious Diseases Act (Amendments) Order 2020, any traveler arriving in Brunei Darussalam is required to undergo mandatory self-isolation. Failure to comply to this requirement is an offence under the Infectious Diseases Act (Chapter 204) and if found guilty, will be liable to a fine for up to **\$10,000** or **imprisonment for a period of up to 6 months** or both
